<p>1 NOT YET WITHIN EXPECTATIONS The student may need help to read brief, straightforward materials with some specialized language. Work is often vague or incomplete.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• little evidence of understanding
<p>2 MEETS EXPECTATIONS (MINIMALLY) The student reads elaborated materials with specialized language. Work is somewhat vague and occasionally incomplete. Makes notes with categories - may miss key information or connections.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• basic responses with very little detail, vague• brief notes often with no headings• misses questions
<p>3 FULLY MEETS EXPECTATIONS Work is clear, specific and complete. Restates main ideas in own words. Includes details from text and graphics. Makes notes with categories. Makes supported inferences, interpretations.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• logical and generally complete responses, but not all support is developed - ie. mentions symbols of dragon but does not interpret them• accurate, detailed notes with categories, headings
<p>4 EXCEEDS EXPECTATIONS The student reads complex materials with sophisticated language and abstract content. Work is thorough and insightful. Uses quotations effectively.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• relevant text detail, often with quotations and specific references• insightful• interprets symbols of dragon• explains relationship between chart and text
